

Mara Plains

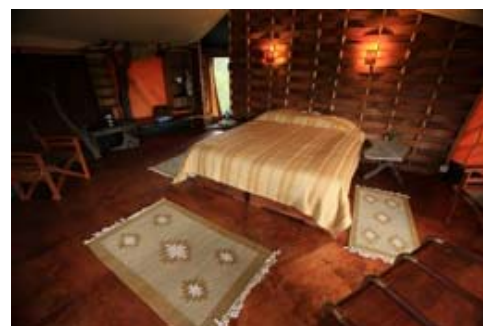


The Camp is a small, high quality camp under canvas that is located within the private Olare Orok Conservancy and just a few hundred meters to the north of the Masai Mara National Reserve boundary. It is situated along the Ntiakatek River with views of the surrounding plains and riverine forest. The camp has

been designed and built to be as environmentally friendly as possible and is a founding member of the new Mara North Conservancy, allowing our guests the privilege to game drive in the Masai Mara as well as in the more private Olare Orok and Mara North conservancies, away from the crowds. In the process, for the first time, close on 1000 Maasai landowner families are now earning guaranteed monthly rentals from their land that created the conservancies.

Mara Plains Camp caters for only 12 guests in six spacious and comfortable en-suite canvas rooms built on raised decks. Each of the six rooms has en-suite bathroom facilities, with hot water that is solar heated. There are additional tents for a pilot of private guide or for slightly larger groups.

The central living area is under canvas with a dining tent and two comfortable lounge tents. Along the river under cool shade is a grassy outdoor area to bird watch or enjoy a leisurely lunch under the trees. Mara Plains' 4x4 game-viewing Landcruisers have been designed for comfort with only four or possibly five guests per vehicle. This ensures increased maneuverability for better viewing, photography and an easy environment
