

Katavi Wildlife Camp



Foxes Katavi Wildlife camp is set back in amongst the bush on the edge of Chada flood plains in the Katavi National Park. Katavi National Park is universally recognized as one of the few truly remote and untouched areas of Tanzania's immense conservation areas. This is primarily due to its position in the far south west of the country and the associated cost and time involved in reaching the park.

For those who do take the time to visit, an unforgettable safari awaits them. Being one of the least visited National Parks is a bonus for the few who make it, not a reflection on the experience to be had there – it is a place for those seeking the Africa of decades ago.

Katavi Wildlife Camp is very exclusive with only six tents, luxurious in size and furnishings and cunningly set back in amongst the trees that line the floodplain, providing both shade and camouflage in the prime game viewing area of the park, where the wildlife are unaware of your presence. The camp will be small and select with personalized hosting and guiding by an experienced professional guide.



Katavi Wildlife Camp is a seasonal safari operation and is only accessible during the dry season from April until December. Katavi Park has a similar climate to Ruaha National Park, but with a completely contrasting topography, comprising a series of flood plains and fringed woodland teeming with wildlife (many of which are not found in Ruaha eg. Topi). You are surrounded by wildlife the moment you

arrive in this remote part of East Africa! Tom Appleby, an experienced zoologist and professional guide, will host your visit and lead game drives and walks, to encounter the wondrous African animals that you have travelled so far to see. Specially adapted 4x4 wheel drive vehicles are used on game drives, with two-way radio contact and tiered seating for good animal viewing.
