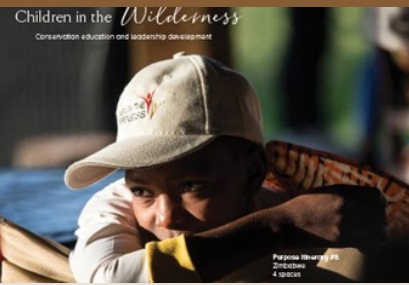


JOURNEY WITH PURPOSE

Zimbabwe (south eastern Hwange National Park)

September 13th—18th, 2018

Actively participate in game count and anti-poaching activities supervised by experts in the field. Observe and participate in the collaring of an elephant cow. Engage with local community on Human Wildlife Conflict

Proceeds to: Scorpions Anti-Poaching Unit

Frontier Ecotourism Presence

Zambia (remote northern Kafue)

October 22—27, 2018

- Observe darting and collaring of cheetah and lion
- Participate in aerial survey of Busanga Plains large mammals
- Exposure to and interaction with local experts and authorities

Proceeds to: ZCP/anti poaching

Mega Moves of Mega Fauna - Black Rhino Ear Notching

Rwanda (Akagera National Park)

October 22—27, 2018

Opportunity to see the Critically Endangered eastern black rhino (*Diceros bicornis michaeli*), reintroduced into Rwanda in 2017.

Get hands on with Headquarters operations at Akagera National Park.

Proceeds To:: Akagera

Addressing Human Wildlife Conflict

Namibia (Kaokoveld & Skeleton Coast)

November 26—December 1st, 2018

- Learn about the carnivores (*lion; brown hyaena*) of the Namib Desert with well-known local authorities. Actively engage with rural communities to understand pastoralism, local culture and Human-Wildlife Conflict.

Botswana (Kalahari & Linyanti)

February 10—14, 2019
