

Olivers Camp

Near the little visited eastern region of Tarangire National Park, Oliver's Camp offers rustic luxury, excellent game viewing and exceptional birdlife.

The park stretches from the Simanjiro plains, where zebra and wildebeest give birth, to the western river beds which when dry, are home to a vast array of game including huge herds of elephant at certain times of the year.

Working in conjunction with the local leaders, Oliver's Camp is the first permanent facility in the region to bring together wildlife authorities and the local community to build a low impact, sustainable tourism project. The staff are renowned for their friendliness and the guides offer a unique insight into this fascinating area where the dynamic struggle for survival has gone unchanged for many years.

The camp, lying in the heart of this amazing ecosystem has just five tents set well apart from each other, and is ideal for those who appreciate privacy as well as unique safari opportunities. The great stone fire place, near the library and dining tents, has wonderful views and is a convivial focal point for mulling over the day's adventures. Long or short walking safaris, off-road expeditions in open vehicles and fly camping are all possible in this beautiful wilderness.



Being in the middle of vast wilderness zone presents many unforgettable opportunities... game drives – long undisturbed journeys in open vehicles, exploring the park, ensuring the best of wildlife viewing. Alternatively feel Africa beneath your feet – a walking safari within Tarangire is a truly unique experience. Walks vary in scope and nature they can be few easy hours over open terrain or they can be longer hikes through a variety of habitats ending with a night of fly-camping in the

midst of animal rich wilderness of the park.
